We've had another successful year of growing our own entrepreneurs in Coles County. Not only has the third year been our largest class, but we continue to experience more involvement from community business leaders that spurs on intergenerational learning. This dual-credit class encourages entrepreneurial thinking, problem-solving and work skills development and is offered through Mattoon, Charleston and Oakland school districts. ClassE is privately funded and supported by approximately 60 of Coles County's businesses. Both Lake Land College and Eastern Illinois University have also been great supporters of this class.

ClassE was named by the inaugural class and developed using the same concept as the first CEO Class in Effingham but modified to meet the vision of the Coles County business community. Both entrepreneurs and educators are represented on the board to ensure that we achieve the educational standards but still embrace the "learning by doing" philosophy. ClassE's administrative agent is Eastern Illinois Education for Employment System (EIEFES) and the fiscal agent is the Southeastern Illinois Community Foundation.






